

ever closer to God and not stagnate in the ways of the world. This is the message from this weekend's Scripture readings.

In the first reading from Exodus (3:1-15), Moses encounters God via the burning bush and hears God's plan to release the Israelites from slavery by the Egyptians. It was the beginning of Moses' reformation from being a shepherd to becoming a prophet for the Lord, an ongoing spiritual growth in the Lord. When we read about how the Lord directed Moses in his reformation, we realize that this is God's plan for all of us. We, too, are called to reform from our worldly ways and to grow in the ways of the Lord. This is not an easy task. We know all the troubles Moses had in trying to lead the people of Israel along the way of the Lord. At times they were ready to do him in because of the hardships along the way, but Moses generally kept on growing in his faith in the Lord and even stood in the breech between God and his people when things didn't go well for them and God wanted to vent his anger. Though Moses was a man of growing faith, even he succumbed to anger and got in trouble with the Lord along the way and never entered the land of milk and honey promised by God. What a valuable lesson for all of us: we must persevere in our growth in the Lord, trusting that he will guide us and always show us the way.

In Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, the second reading for today (1 Cor 10:1-12), we are warned not to get overconfident in our spiritual life because God will be displeased with us if we fail to grow in our faith: "All ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink, for they drank from a spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was the Christ. Yet God was not pleased with most of them, for they were struck down in the desert. These things happened as examples for us, so that we might not desire evil things, as they did. Do not grumble as some of them did, and suffered death by the destroyer. These things happened to them as an example, and they have been written down as a warning to us, upon whom the end of the ages has come. Therefore, whoever thinks he is standing secure should take care not to fall."

Luke's gospel (Lk 13:1-9) is a lesson for us also, Quoting Jesus as saying that it is a time to reform our lives, and not become satisfied with the status quo. Twice he used the phrase: "But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did!" when he was asked to comment whether the deaths of seemingly innocent people were related to their sins. This also applies to all of us. If we become like the fig tree that bears no fruit in the parable in today's gospel, Jesus tells us by way of the parable of the fig tree that we, too, are liable to be cut down: "For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree,' the man told the vine dresser, 'but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?' The vine dresser said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not, you can cut it down." The vine dresser is like Jesus, he gave the fig tree a second chance to bear fruit.

So what does this mean to all of us? Simple! We must take this opportunity during Lent to get back on track with the spiritual growth part of our lives. Often, we get lost along the way because of our sinful nature and we need to find our way back. You probably heard about the mountain climbers who were lost for days in an avalanche of snow and ice. No-one could see nor find

Donatism

Shadows dance against the wall in step with the flickering tongue of the candle in the center of the room, the only source of light in a dark and sequestered space. The ambiance is reverent as the leader of the small group solemnly moves through each carefully choreographed step of the sacred ritual. It is a ritual that has been handed down for generations but it takes no small measure of courage to participate in it this evening. For this is the time of Diocletian; and to be a Christian is a dangerous proposition.

In the silence of the sacrament, it is easy for the group to hear the threatening sound of an approaching horde. The leader lunges forward to snuff out the candle but it is too late. Suddenly the door bursts open confronting this small band of faithful with the terrible visage of the Emperor's wrath. Fear overwhelms the group for they know what lies ahead: imprisonment, torture, and execution, unless they renounce the faith, denying the Lord to whom moments ago they expressed their love in worship.

In the face of such persecution, it does not surprise us that many Christians chose the Emperor over Jesus, though they were well

them, until one of them turned on his GPS (Global Positioning System) and its signal guided rescuers to their aid. We all have a GPS that guides us back to our spiritual track - that is, Jesus Christ. Now is the time to turn it on so that Jesus can guide us and not let us be lost forever. Confess your sins. Reform your life. Reconcile those areas in your life that keep you from following the Lord. Get involved in your faith. Study and reflect on the Bible. Keep Jesus in your heart and on your mind to keep you on track.

Most churches have extra penance services during Lent. Take advantage of this opportunity to get back on track with the Lord.

aware of the martyrs that had gone before them, preferring death for love of Christ to life in denial of Him. Those that gave up the sacred books, sacred vessels, or their fellow Christians to their persecutors came to be called "traditors;" and when the persecutions finally ended, they remained held in contempt by other Christians who had not given in to the oppression. So it was that the stage was set in the early 300's for the rise of a schism known as Donatism.

It was named after Donatus, a North African bishop. In his book The Fathers Know Best, Jimmy Akin puts it this way: "The schism concerned the proper treatment of those who had compromised the Christian faith during persecution. The Donatists held a rigorist attitude and deemed sacraments celebrated by compromised churchmen to be invalid." The Church, however, did not hold that view and recognized that a lawful bishop, even if they had succumbed under the pressure of persecution, was still the lawful bishop of his see. Donatists held such bishops as being excommunicate by virtue of their "traditor" status and installed other bishops claiming the

This schism lasted for about a century and came to involve acts of violence perpetrated by the opposing parties. In the early 400's St. Augustine participated in a debate between Donatists and Catholics in an attempt to repair the rift. Eventually, the influence of Donatism waned and came to an end.

Apply Your Faith

Today we are not being bullied into giving up our sacred texts, vessels, or fellow Christians – at least not here in the United States. We have, however, been scandalized by pedophiles within the priesthood and we probably all know people (my own brother included) who have used that travesty as an excuse to cast away the Catholic Church.

It is important to remember that the truth of the Catholicism doesn't cease to be true when a Catholic, even a priest, fails to live according to that truth. The sacraments have their power not because of the priest but because it is the power of Holy Spirit working through the priest




