


Chaplain's Report

Be Watchful!

Message for 12/01/13
1st Sunday in Advent (A)

Advent is a season of watchful waiting: a looking forward to "days to come," a time "to awake from sleep," a time "to prepare for the hour you do not expect," as we hear in today's readings from Isaiah, the letter to the Romans and the gospel of Matthew. We all know that it is the time to watch for the coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, remembering his first coming and preparing for his second coming.

As I grew up in my faith, my attention was focused more on preparations for remembering his first coming which we celebrate on the Solemnity of Christmas, rather than on his second coming which we encounter when the Lord calls us home to his heavenly kingdom. The older I get it seems that my attention is more on the second coming than the first, and I find myself listening more intently to his words about being prepared. Am I prepared? No. Do I keep putting off until tomorrow what I should be doing today. Yes. Am I afraid? Sometimes. But I find great comfort in



The Church is Catholic

Several years ago I was invited to attend a Lutheran service. My brother-in-law was still in the early days of his faith journey and I wanted to encourage him in his walk with Christ, so naturally I went. What struck me at the time was how very similar their service was to the Mass. One of those similarities was the recitation of the Nicene Creed, including the phrase about belief in "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic" church. Speaking with a few of the folks afterward I remarked about the shared creed and was quickly reminded that "catholic" means "universal" and should not be confused with the Roman Church known by that name.

I wish I knew then what I know now. Although "universal" is an acceptable synonym for the word "catholic," it is an inadequate one.

Fr. Robert Barron (2011) points out that the word "comes from the Greek terms kata holos (according to the whole) and thus designates both the internal integrity of the church and its universal outreach. The Catholic Church has all of the gifts that Christ wants his people to have: Scripture, Liturgy, theological tradition, sacraments, the Eucharist, Mary and the saints, apostolic succession, and papal authority." Catholicism p.164.

CCC paragraph 830 also reflects this understanding:

The word "catholic" means "universal," in the sense of "according to the totality" or "in keeping with the whole."

The CCC goes on to describe that the catholicity of the church comes from Christ's presence in her, imparting to the church the complete means of salvation, and from the church's mission to make those means available to all mankind.

The Lutherans I spoke with were right in recognizing the universality of the church insofar as spreading the Gospel throughout the world. It is the reason the church exists. Furthermore, as the CCC 854 points out, spreading the message requires sensitivity to a universal application. "It must involve a process of inculturation if the Gospel is to take flesh in each people's culture." In other words, you have to meet people where they are, and that does reflect the church's catholicity. But that's not the whole story.

The Catholic Church is catholic not just because it is universal. It is catholic because it operates "according to the totality" and "in keeping with the whole" of all Christ gave her to effect the salvation of the human race.

God's words of wisdom: "Come, let us climb the LORD's mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths (Is 2:2)." Now I physically cannot climb mountains, but my heart climbs the Lord's mountain in search of God's blessings. I look forward to reaching the top and seeing God face to face. The Responsorial Psalm 122 also contains words of joy and expectation to see God: "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."

And Paul's words of wisdom in his letter to the Romans 13:11-14 certainly resonate with my current state of life: "Brothers and sisters: You know the time; it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep. For our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed; the night is advanced, the day is at hand. Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in promiscuity and lust, not in rivalry and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the desires of the flesh." I've been there and done that. Now, am I awake or asleep? Have I fully atoned for all the transgressions I've committed in this life on earth? No. That's what really bothers me about climbing God's mountain. Am I worthy? Probably not. But scripture tells me that God loves me and forgives me when I turn to him for his Divine Mercy. What better guarantee can you have than God's Word, which is Jesus Christ? Over and over he has shown us the way, the truth and the life we need to follow in order to come to the Father, that is, how to climb his holy mountain. I can buy that, but when I keep repeating my sinful ways in spite of all my efforts to change, I can't help wondering if God will welcome me in his heavenly kingdom. I'm sure many others feel the same way, especially when they hear the words of today's Gospel from Matthew (Mt 24:37-44): "... stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." Am I awake or asleep? That is the question. Am I preparing for that climb up the mountain or am I putting it off until another day? These are questions we all should be pondering over. After all, we know not the day nor the hour we will be called before the Lord face to face and receive his judgment.

I haven't given up hope of becoming worthy of God's mercy and forgiveness because he assures us that he is always faithful to his covenant with us and that we should never despair, but keep trying with the help of his grace. So that gives me great comfort and helps me to be grateful to him for his loving and forgiving heart. Each day as I climb out of my bed, I thank Jesus for another day to work on my climbing skills and ask him to help me through that day to bring his presence to others. When we walk with the Lord, our weaknesses disappear into the strength of his words. After all, didn't he tell Peter to forgive his brother seven times seventy times, and forgave Peter even after Peter had denied him three times? This is the word of the Lord, it gives us hope and joy when we follow it. So, my friends, continue to hope and take comfort in the Word of God, Jesus Christ his Son. We know not when he will come, but keep climbing his holy mountain and you will be prepared and will certainly reach the top.




