It is an understatement to say that this winter has been harsh. However, pitchers and catchers report to White Sox camp on Feb. 15th. Spring cannot be far behind!!!!

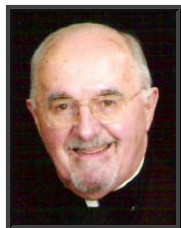

the Christ. Yes, Jesus was born, one like us, into the Holy Family of Mary and Joseph, a loving, humble and prayerful family unit. They were an example of God's intention for all family units, not only the parenting family, but also the whole family of man: the family of neighbors, the family of communities, the family of governments, the family of church, the family of the world. The questions are: Why does the world have so many problems being a family? Why does the church encounter problems being a family? Why do governments have problems being a family? Why do communities fail to be family-like? Why do neighbors have trouble accepting the family example? Maybe it is because the concept of the family of man has been diluted to the point of not recognizing what it's all about. God, in his wisdom, has instructed us in family life by many different passages of Scripture, one of which is the Gospel for today (Lk 2:22-40).

We see how the Holy family faithfully follows God's family planning by consecrating their son, the Son of God, the first born male, back to God as prescribed in the law. Simeon, a holy man, took Jesus, the Christ, into his arms and blessed him and his parents. Not only that, but he, inspired by the Holy Spirit, also warned Mary of the trouble ahead: that **"her child is destined to be the downfall and the rise of many in Israel, a sign that will be opposed, and that her heart would be pierced with a sword - so that the thoughts of many hearts may be laid bare."** This indicated the pain to be experienced by Mary as the Mother of the Redeemer. This also raises the question whether families are willing to accept our Lord as controversial. His values, dos and don'ts, are not always those of our friends and associates. Consequently, if families do not make the values of Jesus, our Lord and Redeemer, a priority in their family life, those families are vulnerable to experiencing the pain and sorrow of failure.

A holy widow, the prophetess Anna, also gave thanks to God for the child Jesus and spoke about him to all who were awaiting redemption. Isn't this our mission also: to speak fearlessly about family values and the presence of Christ within them?

In the book of Sirach (Sir 3:2-14) an exemplary account of what family life should be about is a real role model for all of us: **"God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons. Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and preserves himself from them. When he prays, he is heard; he stores up riches who reveres his mother. Whoever honors his father is gladdened by children, and, when he prays, is heard. Whoever reveres his father will live a long life; he who obeys his father brings comfort to his mother. My son, take care of your father when he is old; grieve him not, as long as he lives. Even if his mind fail, be considerate of him; revile him not, all the days of his life; kindness to a father will not be forgotten, firmly planted against the debt of your sins —a house raised in justice to you."**

This is the kind of family that Jesus, Mary and Joseph exemplify. If the whole world would only reflect upon these virtues, the world would become more like family. Our own personal family unit should reflect the promise of God's intention for families, a family like that of Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

"When the pair (Mary and Joseph) had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee and their own town of Nazareth. The child grew in size and strength,

Know Your Faith

When is the last time you really thought about the Sacraments?

Imagine yourself in the scene. I mean it. Pause for moment and really imagine yourself in the room with the disciples...

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. [Jesus] said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the holy Spirit." John 20: 19-22 NAB

Were you there? Was the room crowded or were you among a select few? What furniture was in the room? Was there a window; was it open? What was the air like or the temperature in the room? Could you hear any noise outside the room? What did you hear? Were you really there?

Most importantly, did you see Him? Did you take note of the wounds in his hands and side? Did you hear him greet you with words of peace? Did you feel the heat and humidity of his breath as he communicated the Holy Spirit to you?

If you can't answer those questions, I encourage you to re-reflect on it. This is no touchy-feely exercise meant to put you in touch with your inner spirituality, although that wouldn't be a bad thing. No, this is meant to illustrate a crucial point.

The bible passage above describes a real encounter with the risen Christ. For those disciples in the room, His presence was undeniable. They could see him, touch him, and hear him. They did feel his breath.

Now here is the point as Thomas Bokenkotter (1986) put it in his book Essential Catholicism: Dynamics of Faith and Belief:

"The saving activity of Jesus, which was visible during his earthly life, is now sacramentalized, rendered visible through the official actions of his body, the Church. The sacraments therefore are primarily and fundamentally personal acts of Christ himself that reach and involve us through his Church. They make possible a reciprocal human encounter with Christ. For it is in the Church's sacraments that Christ wants to make the expression of his saving love visible within the sphere of our earthly live and earthly world." P.184-185 (emphasis added)

Each and every time you participate the Sacraments of the Church, you have a real,

filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was upon him." (Lk 2: 39-40)

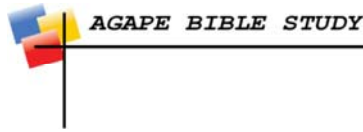

1. **Community Director**

2. **Intellectual Disabilities Fund drive chairman**

The IDF/Tootsie Roll chairman organizes the Council members and outside volunteers to staff collection locations, orders supplies, and prepares any reports required by our State organization. Various Knights assist as captains on given days and/or at various locations.



3. **Pies By The Guys chairman**

The Pies By The Guys chairman would start planning at the September council meeting, which would culminate in pie production and distribution on the Saturday before Thanksgiving. The Chairman solicits and organizes the sales force at all three churches for at least three weeks leading up to the Saturday before Thanksgiving, organizes the weekly pie sales, is the visible lead at Council meetings, recommends outside advertising to increase sales, makes sure online sign-ups are placed on our Council website, communicates with Michelle Heffron on pie production orders, arranges for lunch the day of the production, organizes the distribution at STP & STJN, organizes late pick-up, and timely delivers funds to the Financial Secretary.

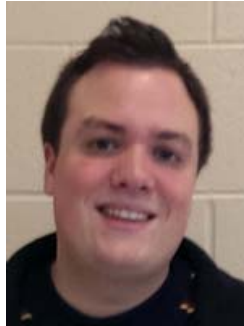

St. Patrick's Men's Bible Study group is hosting a talk by Benedictine Abbot Timothy Wright on Friday night, February 7th at 7:00 pm at Dempsey Hall at SPCR. Timothy's talk is entitled "*Adam of the Bible versus Adam of the Qur'an: The Christian-Muslim divide begins here.*" We invite our Brothers Knights and their spouses to attend if they are interested. After a short talk, Timothy will take questions. The talk is free. Cookies are always welcome.

Timothy entered the novitiate weeks before Vatican II opened. He received degrees from Oxford and the University of London. After teaching and serving as the Abbot of Ampleford and Titular Abbot of Westminster Abbey, he accepted an assignment to work for the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue in Rome. Soon, he was asked to research Muslim-Benedictine relations. He has traveled extensively in the Muslim world. His book based on his doctoral thesis, entitled *No Peace Without Prayer, Encouraging Christians and Muslims to Pray Together, A Benedictine Perspective*, was published recently by Liturgical Press and is available on Amazon and will be available for cash purchase at the talk.

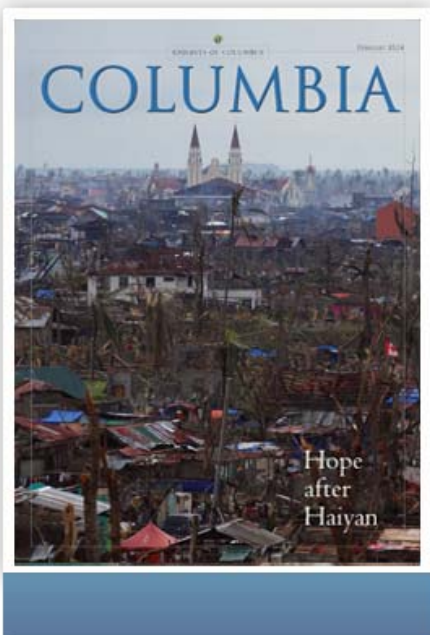

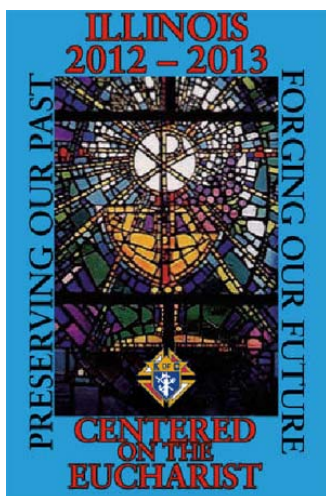
