Tuesday mornings at 7am on Relevant Radio, 930AM or 950AM, is a Q&A with Fr. Frank Hoffman (Fr. Rocky), the Executive Director of Relevant Radio. Fr. do we let outside events influence us and we choose not to know him, love him and serve him.

Tuesday March 25th was the Feast of the Annunciation and The Day of the Unborn Child. Was it just a coincidence that the U.S. Supreme Court heard the Hobby Lobby case on this same day? Both our Council and the Ladies Auxiliary hosted a Mass, Rosary, Divine Chaplet and Adoration with an Honor Guard, praying the entire evening for the end of abortion. This evening was a hidden gem, it was very inspiring, very intimate, you really felt the Lord's presence. Our Council (I) will do a better job promoting this next year.

Have you ever played the Lottery? BK John Hofmeyer has agreed to chair a short-term fundraiser as a trial called Baseball Mania that starts in early June. It is called a sweepstakes but in reality it is a \$20 investment to buy a game card in which you are randomly assigned 3 major league baseball teams each week, weekly cash prizes are awarded over 15 weeks based on the amount of runs scored for your 3 teams in that given week. In essence you are buying a lottery ticket that costs \$1.33 each week and you have to do **NO** work other than make a \$20 investment. All the tracking is done automatically by the Baseball Mania vendor and John. Our District Deputy Chris Brazas presented this idea to us as several of his other councils use this as a fundraiser. Our Council gets to keep \$14 of this \$20 buy-in. If this seems to go over well, then we might do a Football Mania in the fall. We have April and May to communicate with the Council, sell the game cards, report our sales to the Baseball Mania folks as they do all the tracking of winners, and turn our money over to them. We have purchased 200 game cards. If we sell all 200 tickets, we can make \$2,800 for our Council! To put this in perspective, when we work Wristbands at the St. Charles Riverfest, we provide manpower for 3 days to sell Wristbands and we make approx \$2,300. It's a lot of work while at risk for adverse weather.

Our Fraternal year ends on June 30th. Our next First Degree will be on Monday June 9th, 6pm, prior to our 7pm Council meeting at STJN. I again remind you that I denied the Council 3 times before I joined, so keep asking those prospective Catholic gentlemen in our parishes that keep telling us no. Timing is everything.

The end of the Fraternal year also means that Council elections are approaching. BK's Paul Herrmann and Jason Lynch represent the Nominating Committee. If you have an interest in an officer position or even a program chair, please approach the Nominating Committee or myself. I will also be asking the Program Chairs and major event Chairs to be thinking of a succession plan for eventually replacing themselves so we can rotate the responsibilities around the Council. Therefore, please be open if asked by a fellow BK to become more involved.

Lastly, we render to Caesar (IRS) what is owed to Caesar on Tuesday April 15th. You have until April 15th in order to make an IRA contribution for tax year 2013. If you still need to do this, consider making your contribution with our Field Agent Greg Paul (708-601-5489). Greg is also able to assist with 401(k) rollovers and transfers from other qualified plans.

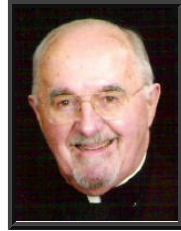

Chaplain's Report

Newness of Life

Message for 4/6/14
5th Sunday In Lent (A)



"Everyone wants to make the best of life. We love life, but we experience daily how brittle it is. There are people who try to live without restraints. They follow the epicurean philosophy of the pagan Romans: "Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we may die." But we could also look at life in the following way: In order to transcend life, I must die to my old, immature, egotistic self. If I wish to become a mature, and grown-up person, I must leave my youth behind me. Does this make sense? Is it meaningful to be generous and dedicated to ideals, to 'mature in Christ,' as the Bible puts it, if everything collapses with death anyway? In the life, suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus, we Christians discover the love of God who calls you and me to an everlasting life with him. The raising of Lazarus is a sign of Jesus' victory over death, and a sign of hope for all of us. In faith, we can regard a life of dedication to ideals as a budding into the full blossoming of life everlasting" (St. Joseph Sunday Missal).

"Lazarus, come out!" That is a cry we all need to hear. "Joe, come out!" "Mary, come out!" All of you, come out!" Come out of the darkness that keeps you from the light, the light of Christ. Yes, in one form or another, we all live some time or another in a darkened chamber called sin. None of us are exempt. Although we know all the right things to do in our lives, we sometimes forget and succumb to the temptation that causes us to do, or not do, or to say, or not say, the things we know we should not do or say. This is our humanity reaching out for self assurance, and that is when we enter the cave of sin, embalmed in the wrappings of self pity or pride. Let's face it, we all have been there at some time or another. It is then the time to hear Christ's call to us: "Come out of that darkness, and bask in my light, the light of life, the light of truth, the way of life that leads to everlasting life." That is what today's gospel (Jn 11:1-45) is all about, the newness of Life.

Another aspect of the newness of life is found in the reading from Ezekiel (Ez 37:12-14). Using the language of vision (i.e., the famous vision of the "dry bones"), Ezekiel sees the Jews in exile to be as dead as the bones of dead men scattered on a battlefield. The Lord brings these bones back to life, and breathes a new spirit into them and resettles them upon their own land. The prophet refers to the exiles' return to the home country, where they will start a new life. Remember that old time religion song about "Dem Dry Bones? "**Dem bones, dem bones, dem dry bones; Dem bones, dem bones, dem dry bones; Dem bones, dem bones, dem dry bones Gonna hear the word of the Lord. Your toe bone connected to your foot bone, Your foot bone connected to**

Know Your Faith

Really? I'm a heretic?

Brothers, I have a confession to make. I didn't know it – honest, I didn't – but apparently, I am a heretic. Please allow me to explain. Recently I was attending a class on Christology. At the start of class, Fr. Wasilewski presented us with a twenty question true/false quiz. The good news, he assured us, was that answering incorrectly did not mean we failed the class and would be kicked out of the program. However, the bad news was that answering incorrectly meant we were heretics and the bonfires were being prepared accordingly. As you have already deduced, I did not answer all of them correctly.

To give you a flavor for the kind of questions that were asked, let me list a sample few. Remember, answer only "true" or "false."

1. Jesus was a human person.
2. Jesus was a divine person.
3. Since Jesus was God, God the Father suffered on the Cross.
4. Jesus had a human soul.
5. Jesus had two intellects, one human and one divine.

Now, my fellow classmates are all what you would consider good Catholics. They attend Mass regularly, engage in personal prayer, devotional reading, bible study, and participate in (often as leaders of) their various parish ministries. However, to my knowledge there was not a single person in our class that answered all twenty questions correctly. Indeed, a few of the questions got the better of several in the class.

Personally, I found the exercise to be an excellent springboard for the discussions we had that day. Whether I got a particular

your ankle bone, Your ankle bone connected to your leg bone, Your leg bone connected to your knee bone, Your knee bone connected to your thigh bone, Your thigh bone connected to your hip bone, Your hip bone connected to your back bone, Your back bone connected to your shoulder bone, Your shoulder bone connected to your neck bone, Your neck bone connected to your head bone, I hear the word of the Lord."

Reapplied to us today, the message, God's word, is: A Christian who is indifferent and/or disappointed by Church life, confused about changes, a person who is about to give up, is like those dry bones. God promises: "I will put my spirit in you that you may live." A Christian believes this and can pray: "With the Lord there is mercy, and fullness of redemption" (Responsorial Psalm 120).

In his letter to the Romans (Rom 8:8-11), Paul states: "Brothers and sisters: Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh; on the contrary, you are in the spirit, if only the Spirit of God dwells in you. Whoever does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the spirit is alive because of righteousness. If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit dwelling in you." The main point is that as a Christian you should respond to this internal power in you. Only then will you really be alive. The divine indwelling is seen as a principle of life.

May the Lord bless your bones and keep his spirit in you!

question right or wrong, the exploration of why it was right or wrong deepened my knowledge of Christ, whom I long to know better, and thereby encouraged a deeper love for Him.

If you really think about it, it even applies to the way you view people you don't particularly like. I'll bet you can come up with an example of a time when your opinion of someone softened once you learned a bit more about what they had been through.

Whether or not you answered the above questions correctly, get to know Jesus better. Get to love Him more. (You might start with CCC 422-483.) And I want you to consider another challenge. Get to know another person better, especially that person you don't particularly like. Get to love them more. That is a path that may prove to be salvation for both of you.

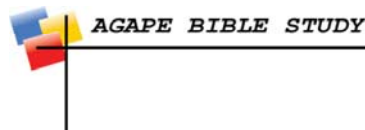

Annuities: More flexible than you might think

Annuities are easily misunderstood, in part because of their name. When you "annuitize" the money you've paid into an annuity (plus the interest it has earned), you've chosen to receive monthly payments for life or for a fixed period.

However, annuitizing this money isn't your only option. You may also treat an annuity something like a Guaranteed Investment Certificate (GIC). That is, you use the annuity as a way to accumulate savings and earn a steady interest rate. You can make withdrawals from the annuity for any reason, although you may then owe income tax on some or all of the withdrawal amount. If you do choose to annuitize, you also have several payout options. The point is, these products are flexible enough to serve a variety of needs.

Contact me if you're interested in setting up an annuity as an RRSP, spousal RRSP, RRIF, a non-registered account, or a TFSA account.

5) Speak to these Brother Knights about how fun it is to fill these eggs with the AHG: Bill, Ed, Russ, Steve, Tom and Tom, Frank....and thank them for bringing along their family

members.

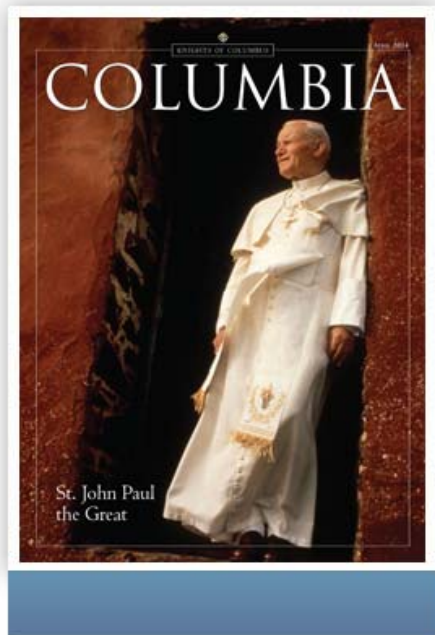

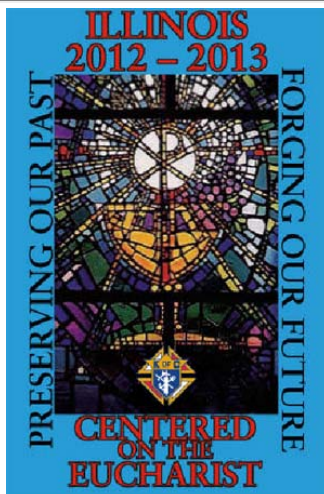
