Theology of the Body from St. John Paul II is the perfect weapon against lust. If you google <u>Christopher West Theology of the Body</u>, you will find his book Theology of the Body for Beginners. I have read the book as it was recommended at a Men Walking With Christ program. I urge you to educate yourselves on Theology of the Body. It is very enlightening.

Sort of along the same topic, I was at one of Fr. Browning's first Masses and during his homily he gave his personal witness on how he found the Priesthood. 

joyous picnic is a symbol of human togetherness. What a salesman does when he stops on the road to eat lunch is entirely different from participating in a thanksgiving banquet. Parties, eating and drinking together, play an important role in our society and signify beautiful values. In Biblical times it was the same. Hence the Bible repeatedly evokes the banquet symbol to describe God's love and humankind's relationship of love with him. The writers of the Bible

were fully aware that human beings do not have the concepts and terminology to describe adequately who God is and what he does to us by adopting us as his children, or how all of this will be fully accomplished in the hereafter. So they utilized the banquet symbol as an apt sign to indicate the lines along which we should think when we meditate on God and what he has in store for those who love him (see 1 Cor 2:9). Rather than being too inquisitive about details, we should hope for a happy future with the spontaneous and simple excitement of a child who sees the packages around a Christmas tree but must wait. "The eyes of all look hopefully to you, [O God] ..., you open your hand and satisfy the desire of every living thing" (Responsorial Psalm 145).

The prophet known only as Second Isaiah addresses the captives in Babylonian exile [as we hear in today's first reading from the book of the Prophet Isaiah 55:1-3]. He gives them hope by referring them to the eschatological banquet, i.e., the banquet of the end time, when God's kingdom on earth (a kingdom of peace and prosperity for all Hebrews) will be established with an ideal Messiah (anointed king) to rule over them in the name of God. Then God will make a new and everlasting covenant (partnership) with his people. Participation in the bliss of God's kingdom is a free gift of God granted to all on the sole condition that they thirst for God. The Church sees this oracle fulfilled in the reign of God which was initiated in the world by the Lord Jesus and will be fully accomplished in the world to come. As such we should read it meditatively: "Thus says the LORD: All you who are thirsty, come to the water! You who have no money, come, receive grain and eat; Come, without paying and without cost, drink wine and milk! Why spend your money for what is not bread; your wages for what fails to satisfy? Heed me, and you shall eat well, you shall delight in rich fare. Come to me heedfully, listen, that you may have life. I will renew with you the everlasting covenant, the benefits assured to David" (Is 55:1-3).

In rhetorical language, Paul [as we hear in today's second reading from his letter to the Romans brings out that we should have firm hope of participating in the bliss of God's promise, the Messianic Banquet, as we have meditated upon in the first reading. We may be depressed and have to go through times of confusion, but nothing can separate a believing Christian from the love of God that comes to us in Christ Jesus. "Brothers and sisters: What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or the sword? No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom 8:37-39).

In today's gospel: "Taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, (Jesus) he said the blessing, broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, who in turn gave them to the crowds. They all ate and were satisfied, and they picked up the fragments left over — twelve wicker baskets full. Those who ate were about five thousand men, not counting women and children" (Mt 14:13-21). This event, the feeding the people, is a messianic sign that will find fulfillment in the true messianic banquet, the Eucharist, which contains the promise of everlasting life in God's kingdom. The Prayer after Communion sums it all up: "Lord, you give us the strength of new life by the gift of the

#### **Know Your Faith**

"You're so smart," she gushed.

That's right, gushed. It reminded me of the scene in "Raiders of the Lost Ark" where all the girls in the classroom are staring dreamily at Professor Jones, one of them batting her eyes to reveal the words "love" and "you" written on her eyelids. In real life though it was the "Catholic Doctrine" classmate sitting in front of me, her admiration directed at Fr. Matt McMorrow; and it might have proved challenging to him in the exercise of the virtue of humility.

CCC 2559 identifies humility as "the foundation of prayer" and CCC 2565 adds that prayer "is the habit of being in the presence of the thrice-holy God and in communion with him." In scripture, Our Blessed Mother extols humility in her Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55); and Peter exhorts us "Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility" and reminds us that "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble." 1 Peter 5:5.

In this light, consider the classroom scene described above. How would you respond were you in the place of Fr. Matt? What kind of response would be truly humble?

The root of the word "humility" comes from the Latin word "humus," meaning "ground," "earth," or "soil" (among other possibilities). Thus, to be "humble" is to be grounded, to be in reality, not somewhere above, nor somewhere below.

For example, Fr. Matt might have responded to my classmate by affirming that he was indeed smart, his intelligence having come from the years of study and effort he put forth; Eucharist. Protect us with your love and prepare us for eternal redemption."

May you rejoice in the messianic banquet, the Eucharist, and let it strengthen you all the days of your life! (All of the above is taken from the St. Joseph Sunday Missal)

The other side, though sometimes more difficult to recognize, is nevertheless the same coin. It's the "below ground" side that is characterized by self-deprecation. Sometimes we mistake this as humility but in reality it too is pride. Both sides of this coin put the focus on self.

I can't tell you for certain what was in Fr.
Matt's head or heart at the time, but I can tell
you what I observed. First, he smiled a bit,
casting his gaze downward briefly. Then he
raised his eyes again and simply said, "It's the
faith."

That, brothers, is humility.






