On Thursday evening October 2nd, the Fox Valley Pregnancy Center held its annual benefit banquet and our Council being represented by golf committee chairman Ron Newman was able to present our golf outing check in the amount of \$16,000 to FVPC Executive Director Trish Theriault. The golf outing in July was the 15th year and best results to date! What is especially rewarding is to witness first hand that these funds are being used by a class organization that is very committed to its pro-life mission. During the dinner, some statistics were shared which I believe were from 2013 in which there were 43,203 abortions in the State of Illinois of which 24,899 were in Cook County and 1,295 in Kane County. Our Order and Council pro-life efforts are as important as ever as every day in our County, three unborn babies lose their life. It is hard to believe as a society that we allow this.



Chaplain's Report

Respect Life Sunday

Message for 10/2/11
27th Sunday In OT (A)



Today is Respect Life Sunday, a time to recall how often life is appreciated or unappreciated whatever the case may be. For 20 years I attended an eight day annual trip to Madonna House in Combermere, Ontario Canada. This is an ecclesial community of celibate men, women and priests who live a life in community to serve the poor, to proclaim the gospel by their lives, to pray, to work as a self sufficient community raising their own vegetables, meat and dairy products, and support numerous field houses all over the world. I am an associate priest for this community and have attended their annual priests' meeting in September.

What a gift of life they have been for me and for all those attending from many parts of the world. There are three days of conferences with inspiring talks, discussions and sharings, liturgies, penance services, and for those who stay longer, a chance to blend into the community by helping out wherever they can. Being limited in what I can do, I help out on their farm by working with the women in canning tomatoes etc.. I always return renewed in faith and love and with a growing respect for life.

Today's gospel message is all about respecting God's great gift of life to all of us, both the born and unborn. The gospel illustrates what happens when there is no respect for life: "He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times." The world should truly take heed of this gospel message since we all are called to bear good fruit by living in accordance to gospel values, or else pay the consequences. Lord knows how much disrespect for life is prevalent in the world today - abortions, euthanasias, death penalties, divorces, murders, terrorism, etc.. We wonder what will come next. Somehow, the world will have to turn the corner and rediscover what love and respect is all about, and change its ways to enable peace and tranquility to return.

Jesus Christ brought us the answer, but he was rejected - "Did you never read in the Scriptures: The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; by the Lord has this been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes? Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit (Mt 21:33-43)."

Today's second reading from Paul's letter to the Philippians (Phil 4:6-9) lays out a message of hope and a plan of action to overcome this great tragedy of a lack of respect for life. If we would only listen and take heed: "Brothers and sisters: Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

Know Your Faith

Of Bishops and Bridges

Brothers, what is the function or purpose of a bridge? Simply put, it is to facilitate the communication of people or things from one side of a divide to the other side. With that in mind, in terms of the basic function or purpose, what is the difference between the Golden Gate Bridge in San Francisco and the Prairie Street Bridge in St. Charles? Functionally, there really is no difference. Both perform the role of facilitating the movement of traffic from one side to the other.

From a practical standpoint, however, the two bridges are quite different. The latter spans only the Fox River while the former spans the Golden Gate strait. As such, the structures that support the bridges are necessarily much different, that of the San Francisco bridge being much more complex and substantial. Thus we see that though the function remains the same, applying the function to particular circumstances changes the requirements and therefore the design of the supporting structure. We can also see that the purpose of the structure is to support the function of the bridge, not the other way around.

The Church too is a bridge. - Its mission is to be salt of the earth and light of the world. This people is "a most sure seed of unity, hope, and salvation for whole human race." ' (CCC 782) You might say it facilitates the movement of man from earth to heaven, from death to life. Of course, like any bridge it needs a supporting structure. When the Church was young and small, the structure was simple. However, as the Church grew to span the globe and two thousand years, it necessarily required the support of a more complex and substantial structure. We call that structure the hierarchy.

The word hierarchy comes from the combination of two Greek words, "hieros" meaning sacred and "arkhein" meaning to rule. This rule is not the pyramidal rule we commonly think of when we think of vassals supporting a lord, supporting a king who sits at the apex of the pyramid. In such a structure, the peasants making up the base bear the burdens that serve only, ultimately, to benefit the king.

No this is the inverse of that type of structure. The church hierarchy has the Pope as its base, supporting bishops who in turn support priests, who in their turn support us, the

Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the God of peace will be with you."

The Responsorial Psalm 80 for today also gives us an insight into the problems of the world and what we must do to correct them: "The vineyard of the Lord is the house of Israel. A vine from Egypt you transplanted; you drove away the nations and planted it. It put forth its foliage to the Sea, its shoots as far as the River. Why have you broken down its walls, so that every passer-by plucks its fruit, The boar from the forest lays it waste, and the beasts of the field feed upon it? Once again, O LORD of hosts, look down from heaven, and see; take care of this vine, and protect what your right hand has planted the son of man whom you yourself made strong. Then we will no more withdraw from you; give us new life, and we will call upon your name. O LORD, God of hosts, restore us; if your face shines upon us, then we shall be saved."

May the Lord bless your life and the lives of all his people that they may grow in awareness of the need to respect life in all its forms - the unborn, the living and the dead.




Bible Study




