

### Co-Knights of the Month





I, for one, have often wondered about this very question. Why is it, LORD, that we wander away from you? That we harden our hearts and no longer fear your retribution when we sin, especially when we actually are trying to follow your way? Remember Flip Wilson, who used to say: "The devil made me do it!" It was said in jest, but how true it is. We find it too easy to place the blame on Satan and not look inwardly into our hearts to see if we are actually trying to follow the way of the Lord. It can be frustrating for us to follow the way of the Lord when there are so many temptations that plague us in this world of ours. It takes a real determination for us to ignore worldly pleasures and seek the way of the Lord.

When God's people returned from their exile in Babylon, they experienced frustration in their attempt to reconstruct the ravaged city of Jerusalem and the temple of the Lord, they blamed their failure on their sins and asked this same question. They were praying for God's intervention and help. Isn't this true for all of us when we find ourselves sinning in spite of ourselves? Why, Lord? Harden not our hearts, we pray. God, we know that we can't do it alone, that we, too, need your intervention and help. And, like God's people in the first reading, we acknowledge our sins and hope for God's mercy to come upon us: "Would that you might meet us doing right, that we were mindful of you in our ways! Behold, you are angry, and we are sinful; all of us have become like unclean people, all our good deeds are like polluted rags; we have all withered like leaves, and our guilt carries us away like the wind. There is none who calls upon your name, who rouses himself to cling to you; for you have hidden your face from us and have delivered us up to our guilt. Yet, O LORD, you are our father; we are the clay and you the potter: We are all the work of your hands."

Today, the first Sunday in Advent, is the beginning of the season of watchful waiting, a waiting for the coming of the Lord, remembering the first coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, the promised Messiah, and, hoping and praying that he will find us acceptable for his promise of everlasting life in the glory of his kingdom in heaven when he comes again. Responsorial Psalm 80 is an echo of that prayer: "Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved. O shepherd of Israel, hearken, from your throne upon the cherubim, shine forth. Rouse your power, and come to save us. Once again, O LORD of hosts, look down from heaven, and see; take care of this vine, and protect what your right hand has planted, the son of man whom you yourself made strong. May your help be with the man of your right hand, with the son of man whom you yourself made strong. Then we will no more withdraw from you; give us new life, and we will call upon vour name."

Paul, in his first letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor 1:3-9), reminds them (and us) of the grace that God gives us through his testimony to his Son, Jesus Christ: "I give thanks to my God always on your account for the grace of God bestowed on you in Christ Jesus, that in him you were enriched in every way, with all discourse and all knowledge, as the testimony to Christ was confirmed among you, so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will keep you firm to the end, irreproachable on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful, and by him you were called to fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord."

#### **Know Your Faith**

#### Family Prayer

Some time ago, Father Patrick Peyton used the phrase "The family that prays together, stays together," as a rallying cry for his Family Rosary Crusade. Since then there have been numerous studies that show correlations that seem to bear this out. It behooves us then, as leaders of our respective domestic church, to incorporate a regular practice of prayer in our family interaction.

If you're like me, you might be a little hesitant to do this, not because you don't like the idea or doubt that it has merit, but rather because you just don't think yourself competent in this area. If so, then I encourage you to consider G.K. Chesterton's wise words, "If a thing is worth doing, it is worth doing badly."

Chesterton was writing in defense of "amateurs" over "professionals," not inconsistent with the Catholic principle of subsidiarity. However, I use it here in the sense of another phrase: practice makes perfect. A baby's first steps are anything but graceful but who would try to dissuade them from walking?

Fortunately, as a Catholic you have many common prayers to choose from, and you already know them well. It is not so hard to say grace at mealtimes, for example, and you could easily gather all together to share in an "Our Father" at the start of the day before everybody goes off to school or work. As you grow in confidence and family prayer becomes more familiar, try a Rosary or Divine Mercy devotion. You don't have to come up with something novel every time you pray and praying common prayer together helps the family realize their unity - no different from the unity we feel with other Catholics when we pray at Mass.

Of course as wonderful as common prayer is, free form prayer can be powerful too. Praying aloud for others in the family reinforces your love for them, and them hearing it reinforces their love for you. Sharing your thoughts in prayer is sharing yourself and encourages mutual understanding.

If you are wondering how to start a free form prayer, remember there are no rules really, just speak from your heart. However, if you like you can borrow a formula that the Church So, my friends, as we enter into this season of Advent, let us renew our commitment to following the way of the Lord, praying that he will find us awake and watchful for his coming, as we hear in today's gospel from Mark (Mk 13: 33-37): "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come. Watch, therefore; you do not know when the Lord of the house is coming, whether in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or in the morning. May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to all: 'Watch!'"

Stay awake with the Lord!!!






